

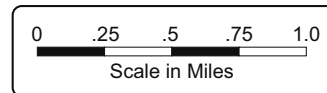
# Shooting Star State Trail



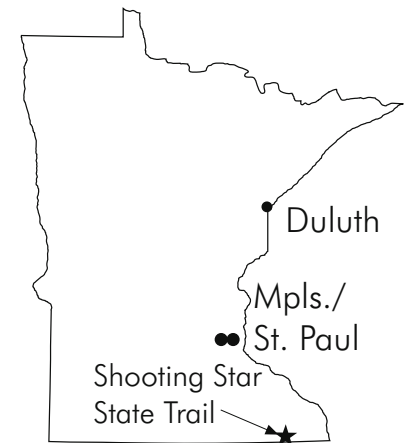
## Map Legend

PARKING AVAILABLE:

**\* Do not leave valuables in your vehicle.**

- In LeRoy, east of County Road 14 on Lowell St.
- At Rowe Pit, north of LeRoy off County Road 14
- In Taopi, on south side of Highway 56, between Maple and Main Streets.

**Share the Trail with Others:**

- Stay on designated trail.
- Keep right so others can pass.
- Keep all pets on leash/Dispose of pet waste.
- Obey traffic signs and rules.
- Pack out all garbage and litter.
- Respect adjoining landowners rights and privacy.
- Warn other trail users when passing by giving an audible signal.
- Overnight camping and campfires are permitted only on designated campsites. Do not leave campfires unattended.
- Enjoy the beauty of wild plants & animals, but leave them undisturbed for all to enjoy.
- Trail users are legally responsible for obeying the rules and regulations provided in Minnesota Rules, 6100.3000.

# Shooting Star

Mower County



The Shooting Star State Trail begins in the city of LeRoy in Mower County, and travels north through Lake Louise State Park. It then heads west towards Taopi, allowing trail users to experience a rural landscape. The trail passes by several additional interpretive/recreational opportunities, including Rustic Retreat Wildlife Management Area, Shooting Star Prairie Scientific and Natural Area, and Mower County Natural and Scenic Area.

When completed, the Shooting Star State Trail will connect the towns of LeRoy, Taopi, Adams, Rose Creek, Austin and Lyle.

Portions of the trail will parallel MN Highway 56, also known as the Shooting Star Wildflower and Historic Route Scenic Byway. The native wildflowers and grasses are a highlight of this trail.



The Great Minnesota Ski Pass is required for all cross-country skiers on public cross-country ski trails who are aged 16 and above. The Ski Pass must be signed and in your possession when skiing on any public ski trail in Minnesota.
